

A NOTE FROM THE DIRECTOR

"The state of trauma can produce an element of reliving the tragic event over and over again. The gift of trauma/tragedy can provide an opportunity to triumph, and eventually transform into a new state of being, and certainly freedom. This was most apparent in the biblical figure Job, when his faith was tested. This is apparent in the African Diaspora ('the dispersion of any people from their original homeland') related to the middle passage, where thousands of slaves were tragically deposited in the Atlantic ocean. Yet, the descendants of these slaves in America transformed their suffering into gifts, including the gift of music (jazz, spirituals, rap). This evening, in Stillwater, Oklahoma, the story of Abyssinia's tragedy to triumph to transformation, is exemplified in her journey. It is a glorious tale of the human experience, to which we all can relate.


