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

Her rendition of "Softly and Tenderly" set the evocative tone for the soundtrack of the Academy Award winning movie The Trip to Bountiful. Her talents bridge the arts of music, theater and cabaret. Her eclectic style allows her artistry full expression. Cynthia currently resides in Santa Fe, NM and is married to lyricist, poet and playwright, Ragan Courtney.

A PERSONAL LETTER TO YOU

I presume you read at least one of the reviews on "Blossom Time," which played in this theatre a few days ago. All four of our city's newspapers spoke of it in such glowing terms that I felt almost repaid for having brought it here.

But coupled with that feeling was one of distinct disappointment. "Blossom Time" was an artistic triumph and a financial flop.

I, however, am not going to talk about the dollars that were lost in bringing it to Dallas. We write that off and go about earning others. My disappointment concerns itself mainly with you—our public.

Here was a play built around a beautiful love story that REALLY happened. Its music was that of the master, Franz Schubert. Its cast was the best that money could procure. Its settings were gemilike in their exquisiteness. Such a production was this that in New York one company could not accommodate the crowds that flocked to see it and it holds the distinction of being the only play that could be seen in either of two theatres on Broadway—both playing at the same time.

It wasn't because we did not let you know what we were bringing to you. We advertised it thoroughly and our friends the newspapers told daily of the treat that was coming. But this jewel of a play was viewed (enthusiastically) by half empty houses at both of its Dallas performances.

Since it has gone folks have told me how sorry they were that they missed it. Whose fault is that?


